But also am about to file a complaint with a few, larger bodies with oversight of matters such as these. One lawyer just offered excellent advice, including that I seek injunctive relief in a higher court. \*also, a 'token' attorney was assigned to represent the respondent/ward/alleged incapacitated person. That lawyer didn't seem to have anything to say except that she opposed the proceedings, but nothing happened. I tried reaching her but no answer yet. It seems she can be held accountable, if no one else.
